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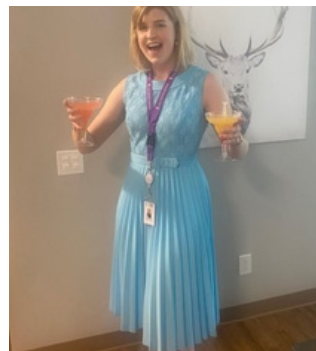

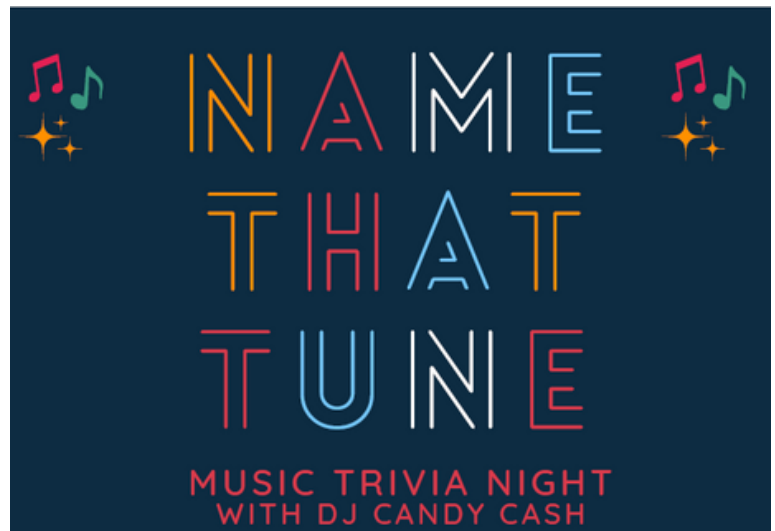

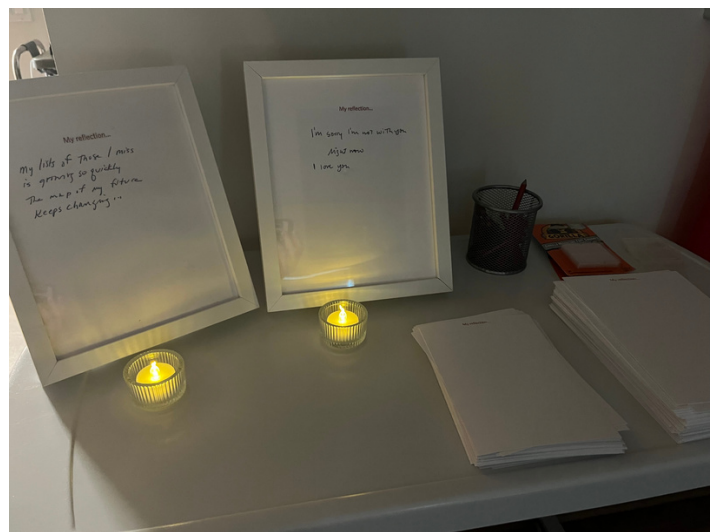
NATIONAL NURSES WEEK 2023

A: Spiders

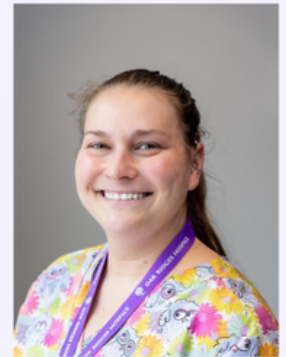

A: I like many genres but I suppose Indie Rock

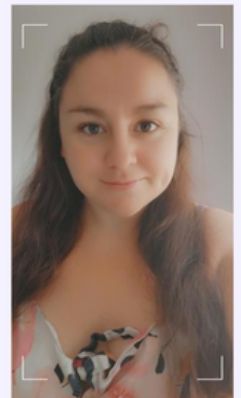

COVID-19 UPDATE FROM OAK RIDGES HOSPICE & MINISTRY OF HEALTH, LONG TERM CARE

Oak Ridges Hospice is thrilled to announce the following COVID-19 Update as of June 27, 2023:

Throughout the pandemic, our Clinical Leadership Team continued to follow the directions of the Ministry of Health and Durham Public Health to ensure the safety of our residents, visitors, staff, and volunteers. We are very thankful that our community has continued to support us as we help them through their family's end-of-life journey.

Updated Guidelines:

- Visitors will no longer need to complete a COVID self-screening questionnaire on arrival at the hospice. Visitors will continue to be required to check in and out with reception. As always, individuals who are feeling unwell should not visit hospice, to protect the vulnerable population we serve.
- Masking for visitors/families/staff/volunteers/physicians is no longer required.
- Oak Ridges Hospice will always be a mask-friendly workplace. Any staff, visitor, resident, or volunteer may mask at any time according to their own comfort level, and masks for those who wish to wear them will be provided.
- Daily COVID symptom assessment of residents will only be completed on symptomatic residents. InfoAnywhere (IA) COVID 19 Screening Assessment has been changed to as needed, and not required daily.
- A reminder: You wear a surgical mask for source control, to protect others. A fit-tested N95 mask is used to protect you against a symptomatic individual.
